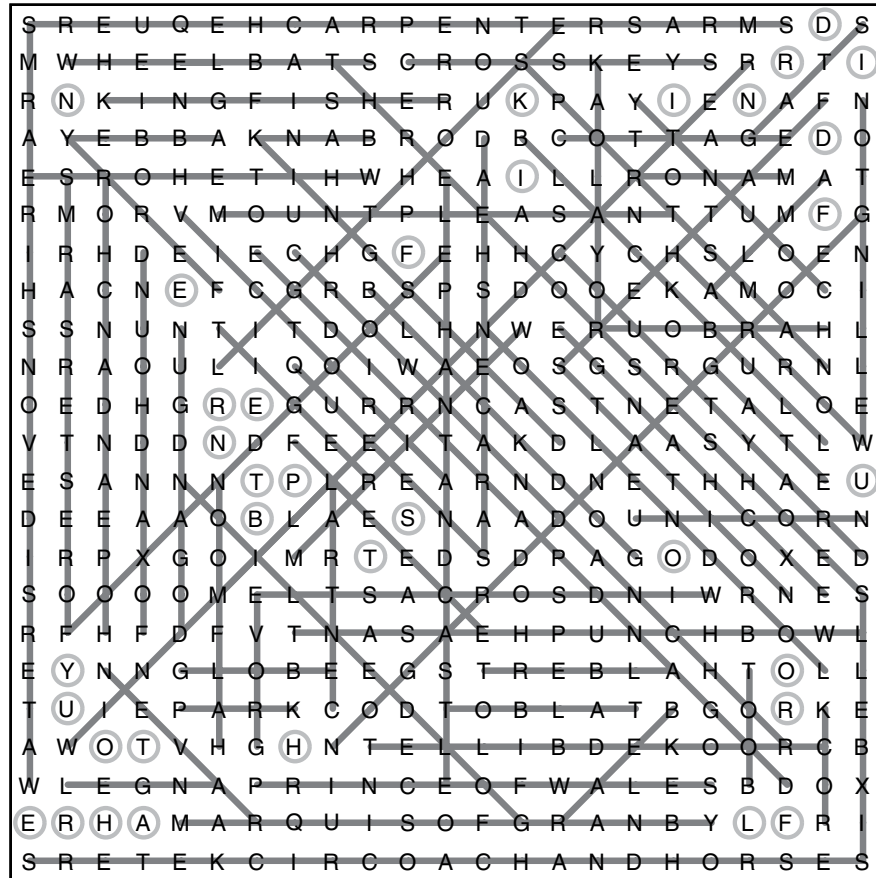


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD UK PUB NAMES

LATERAL THINKING: CRYPTIC

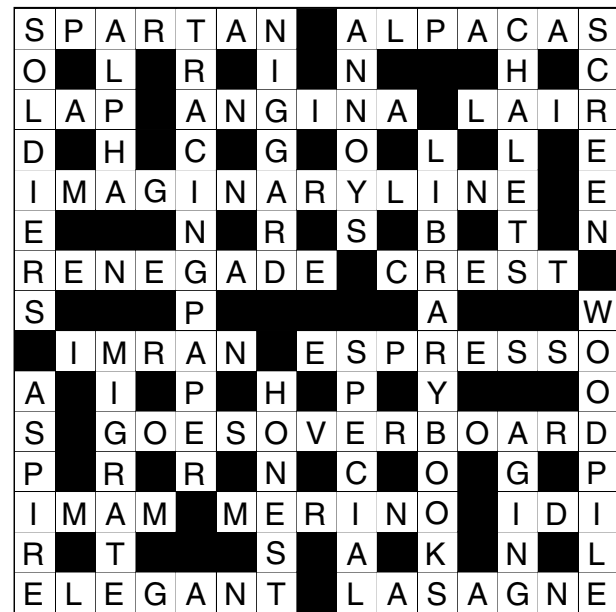

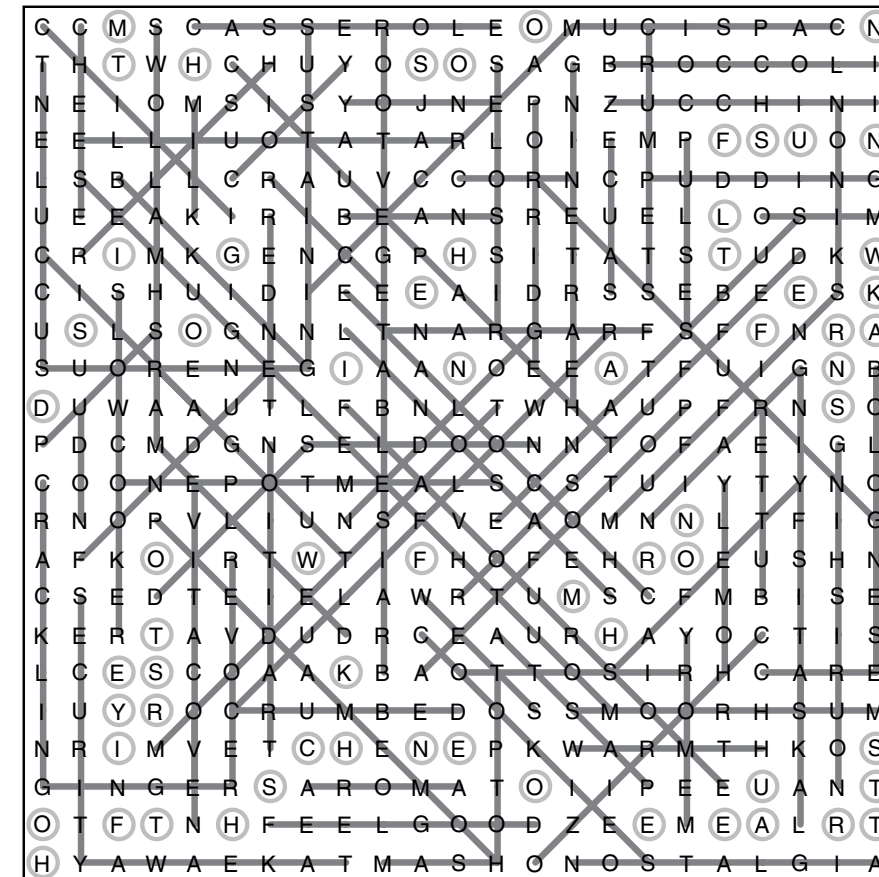
