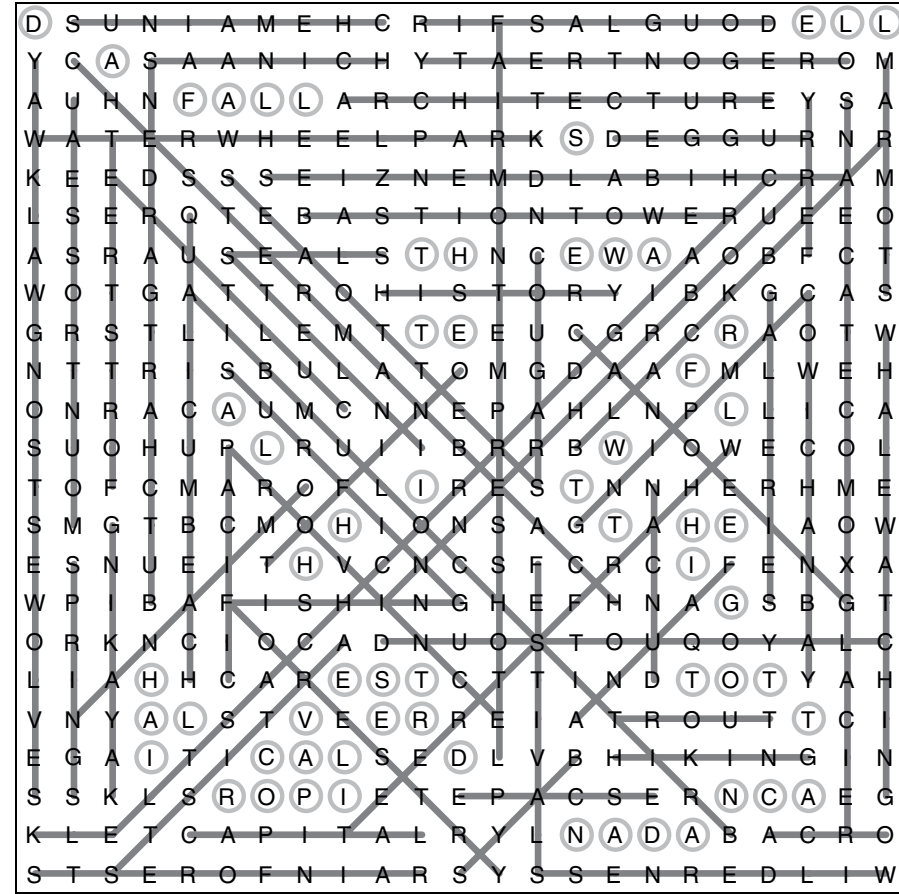


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD VANCOUVER ISLAND

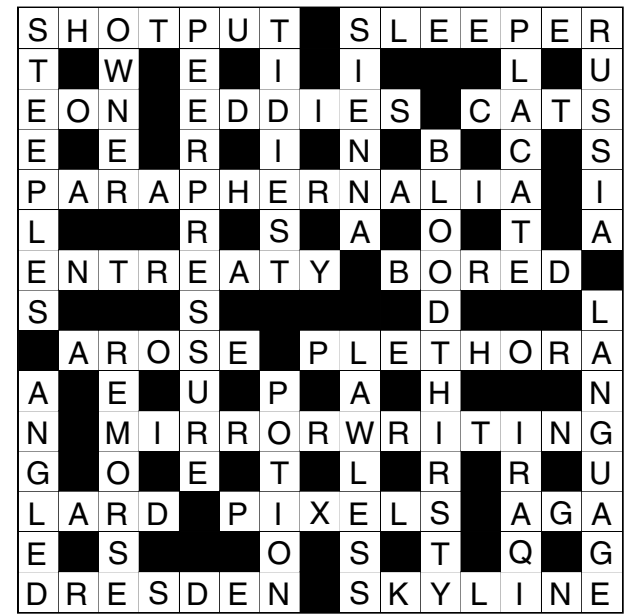

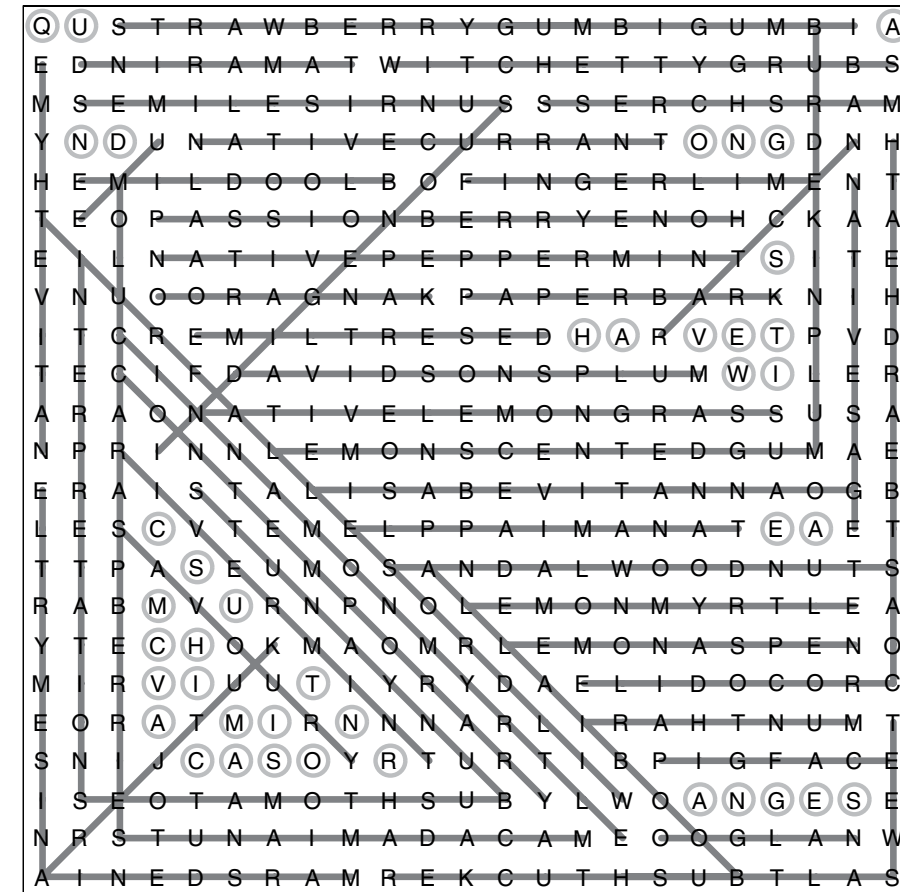
