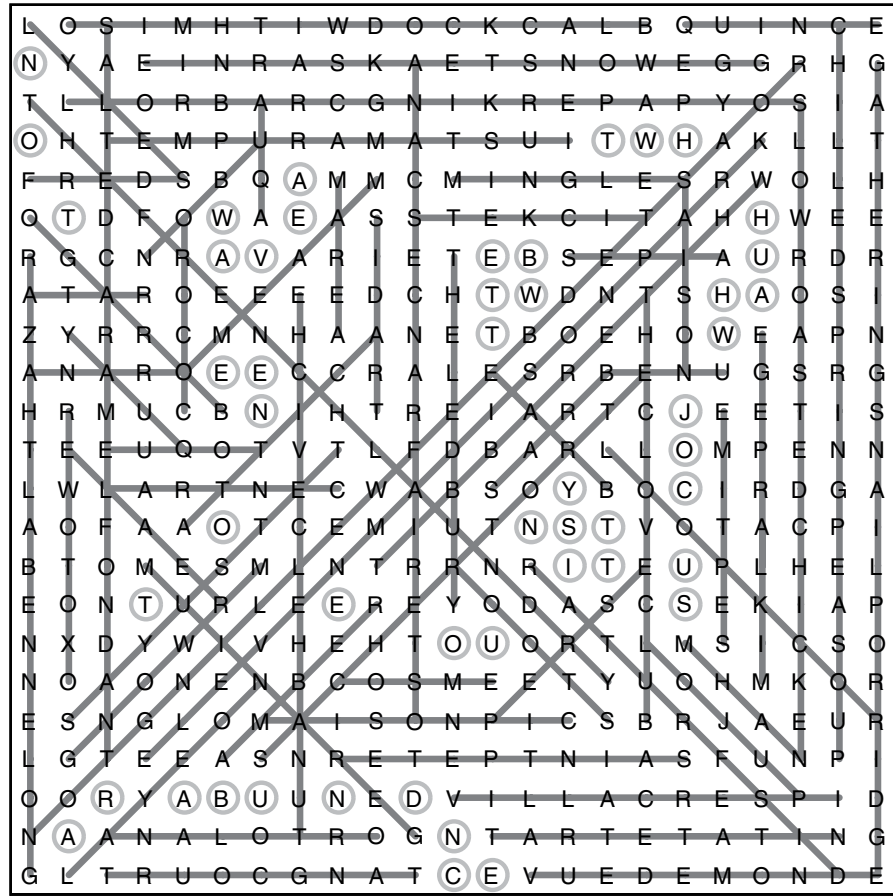


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD EPICUREAN

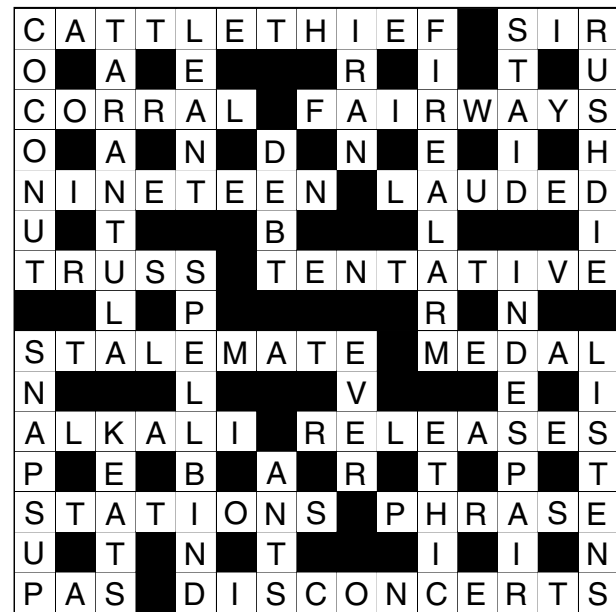

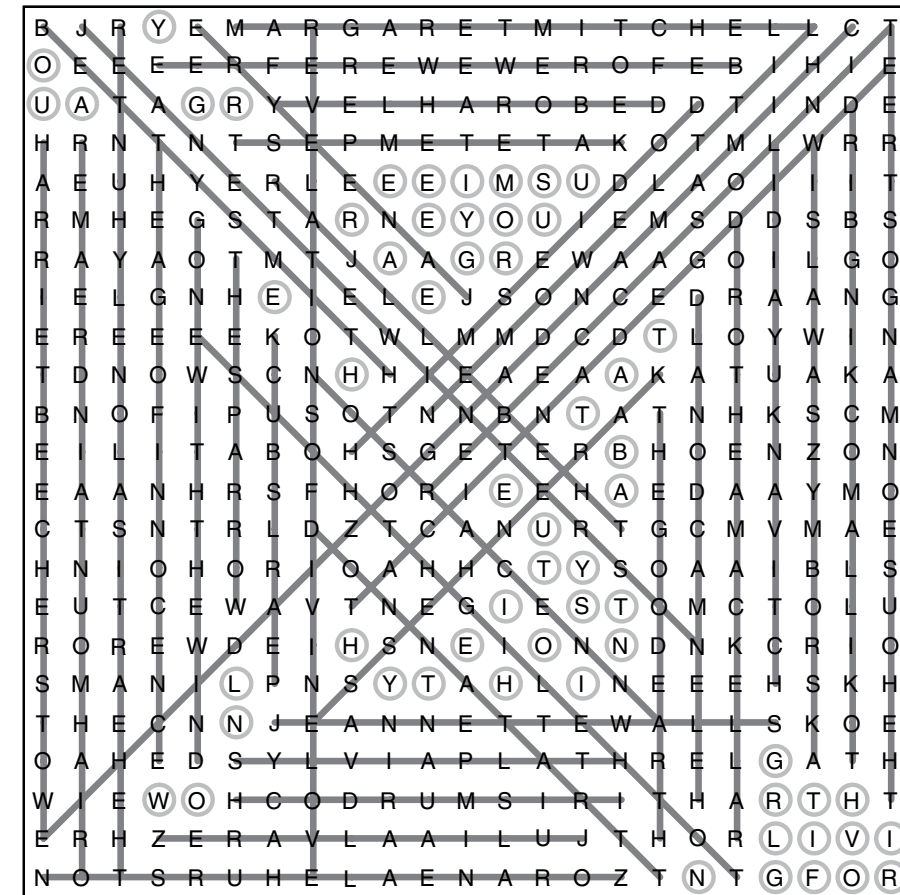
