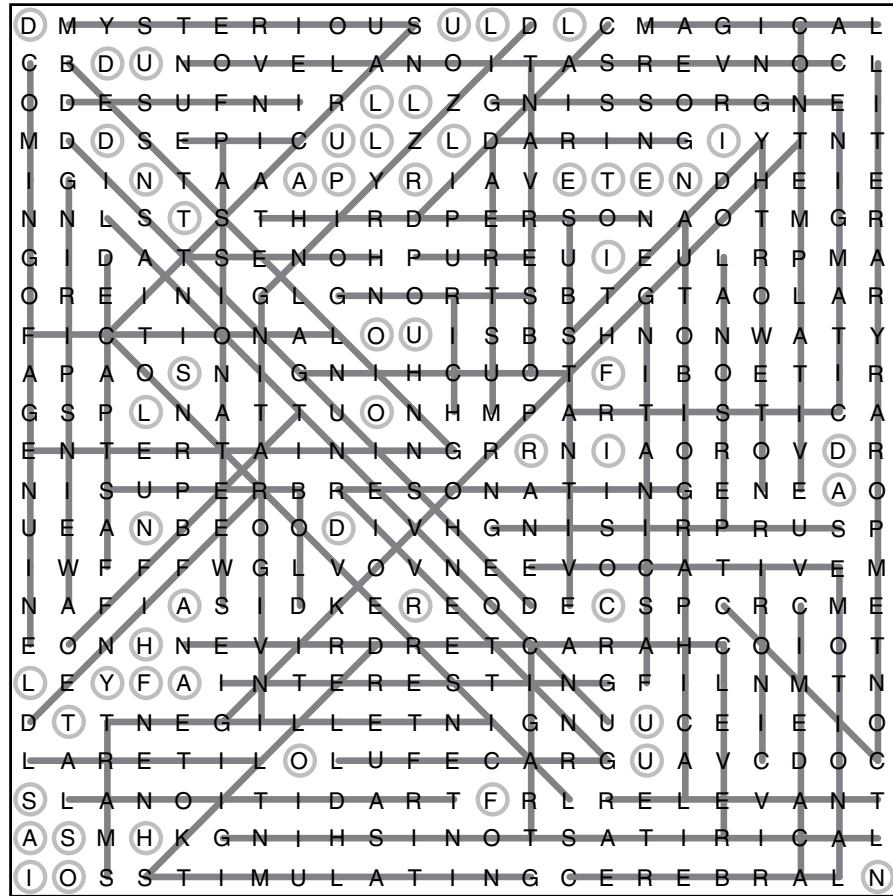


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD BOOK REVIEW

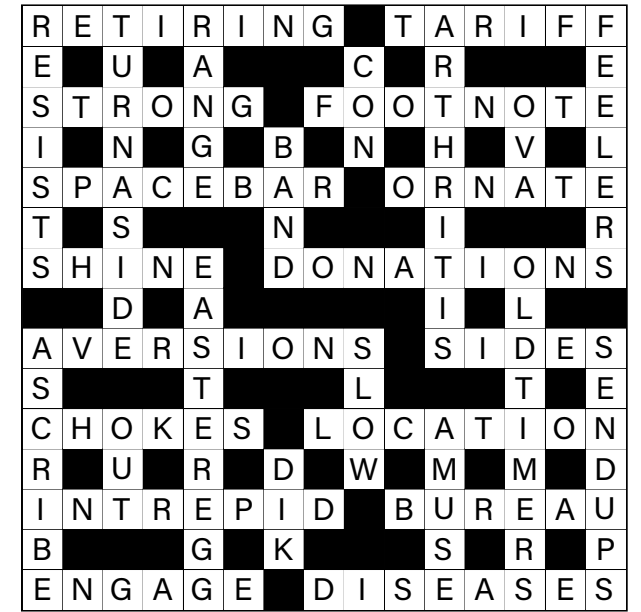

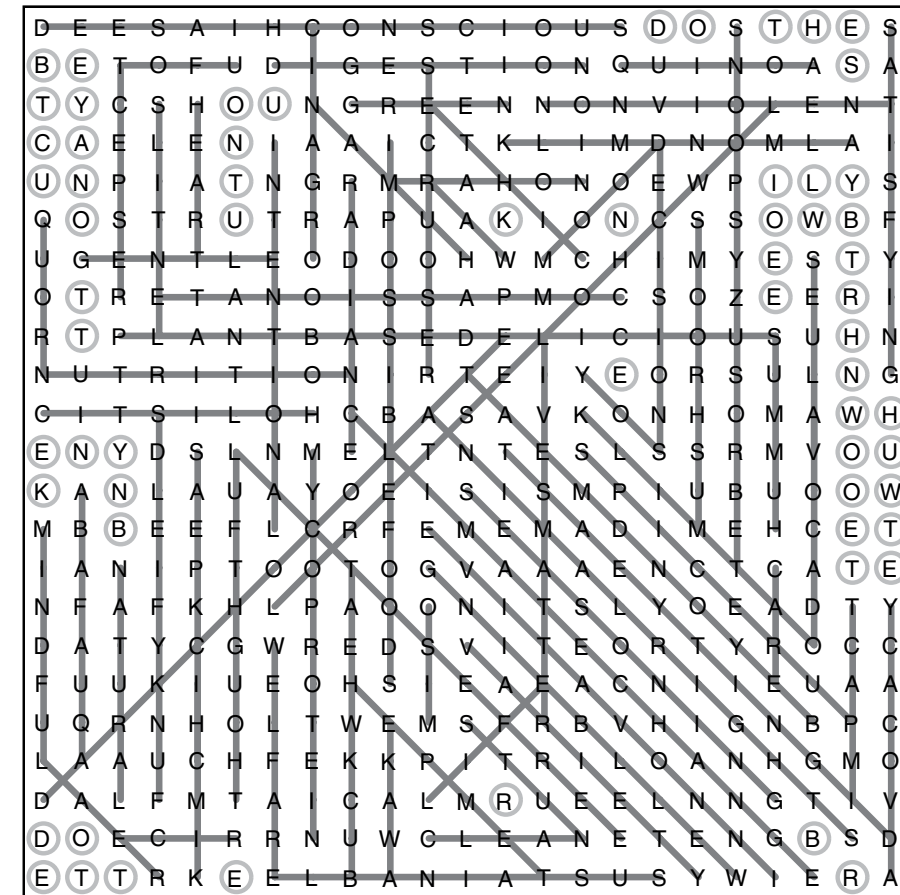
